Message from the University President

A JOYOUS 2022

The year 2022 was truly another blessing for Quezon City University (QCU) as we continue our quest to offer quality higher tertiary education through research, community engagement, and instruction that surpasses accreditation requirements.

In 2022, four core programs, namely the Bachelor of Science in Entrepreneurship, Information Technology, Industrial Engineering, and Electronics Engineering received their Level 1 Accreditation for ALCUCOA, which is a testament to our commitment to continuously improve and evolve as an institution of higher learning.

Our university also started offering two new programs: the Bachelor of Science in Management Accounting (BSMA) and the Bachelor in Early Childhood Education, as part of the University's efforts to cater to the demands of the highly globalized society.

We continued to reap the benefits of being an institutionally recognized higher education institution (HEI) by the Commission on Higher Education (CHED) with almost 10,000 students included in the 2022 UNIFAST grant this ensured that quality education is accessible to our youth..

QCU has successfully transitioned to hyflex learning, with face-to-face classes being conducted after two years of being limited to online learning due to the COVID-19 pandemic. The QC Government also continued providing laptops and pocket wifi to our students and faculty members to ensure unhampered learning amidst the threat of the pandemic.

In terms of community engagement, QCU successfully concluded its Executive Course for Barangay Leaders on Service Delivery Programs for the OSY or BLeSDS for the OSY, a project supported through a grant from the United States Agency for International Development (USAID) and the Education Development Center (EDC). More than 170 Barangay, Sangguniang Kabataan, youth, community, cross-sectoral, and out-of-school youth leaders from Quezon City benefited from the 120-hour Executive Course, which concluded with the presentation of their project proposals in a youth summit held on July 2022.

QCU has also worked hard to expand the reach of its urban farming efforts through the Center for Urban Agriculture and Innovation (CUAI) and our community extension projects under QCU's flagship extension program Simula, Malasakit, I-angat, Lingap, at Eksperto (SMILE) Program. We have established a total of 48 community partnerships, with more than 1,197 beneficiaries.

Our University has placed emphasis on fostering a strong research culture with more than 28 researches produced. QCU also strengthened its network and linkages by partnering with different research organizations and institutions like the Asia-Pacific Consortium of Educators and Researchers, Inc. (APCORE) in the conduct and hosting of various training, seminars, and conferences.

We have achieved a lot in terms of our three-fold functions as an HEI - research, extension, and instruction. Truly, 2022 has been a joyous moment of success and accomplishment for us. For this, we are truly thankful!

HISTORY OF QCU

The story of Quezon City University is a classic narrative – a sweeping story of QC and QCitizens that spans almost three decades. It began in 1988, when the Quezon City Council passed an ordinance to create a technical committee that would conduct a series of studies on the establishment of the City’s University. The committee was composed of Quezon City officials with – the QC Mayor as the Chairman, Vice Mayor as the Co-chairman, Councilor-Chairman of the Committee on Education as the Vice-Chairman. Likewise, the City Treasurer, Director of the Bureau of Higher Education (Department of Education, Culture and Sports), a former University of the Philippines (UP) President, representatives from Pamantasan ng Lungsod ng Maynila (PLM), Technological University of the Philippines (TUP) and Polytechnic University of the Philippines (PUP), and four members of the City Council were part of the technical committee as members. After much discussions and deliberations, Quezon City’s Local University - the Quezon City Polytechnic University was created on March 1, 1994, by the virtue of the City Council Ordinance No. SP-0171. QCPU was initially and specifically established for the training and development of skilled and technical workers.

Three-year Associate Programs were introduced in QCPU in Academic Year 1994- 1995, which were designed to develop highly competent technicians in the field of Automotive Technology, Electrical Technology, Welding, Refrigeration and Air- Conditioning Technology, and Fashion Technology. The institution offered additional three-year Associate Programs for Electronics Technology, Mechanical Technology or Machine Shop, Computer Technology, and an industry-led pilot course in Boiler Technology by the following Academic Year. Thus was built QCPU’s reputation among local government units as a model technology-based institution. This also paved the way for its recognition by the Technical Education and Skills Development Authority (TESDA) and the formation of a strong alliance with the Japan International Cooperation Agency (JICA) also followed.

Through several ordinances: SP-544, S-97; SP-1030, S-2001; SP- 1945, S-2009; QCPU evolved to have its own charter and further strengthened its management. By AY 2005-2006, it started to offer bachelor’s degree programs for Entrepreneurial Management, Industrial Engineering, and Information Technology. The BS Electronics Engineering was initially offered in AY 2010-2011.

To support the K-12 initiative of the national government, the University temporarily offered the Senior High School program through the enactment of City Ordinance SP-2308 in 2014. Thus, QCPU started accepting senior high school students from AY 2016- 2022.

By virtue of SP-2812 or the Quezon City University Charter of 2019 , QCPU was converted to Quezon City University. That academic year saw the initial offering of the Bachelor in Accountancy program while technical and vocational course offerings were discontinued.

On October 8, 2020, after the search committee for president recommended three (3) qualified applicants and nominees, the University Board of Regents appointed Dr. Theresita V. Atienza as its first elected University President with a fixed six year-term. Dr. Atienza envisions QCU to be recognized as the # 1 local university of employable graduates.

Since its establishment, QCU has evolved significantly. QCU now offers degree program in accountancy and entrepreneurship, information technology, and engineering from being a technical education provider. And soon, QCU will cater to more talented and deserving students by providing relevant undergraduate and graduate programs that meet domestic and global markets' demands to Quezon City University and enhancing its charter" was fully implemented.

In October 2022, QCU's four core programs, namely the Bachelor of Science in Entrepreneurship, Information Technology, Industrial Engineering, and Electronics Engineering underwent Level 1 Accreditation from the Association of Local Colleges and Universities Commission on Accreditation or ALCUCOA. The Certificates of Accreditation were awarded to the University on December 22, 2022, by ALCUCOA's President and Executive Director, Dr. Raymundo P. Arcega. Starting AY 2022-2023, QCU also offered two additional programs - the Bachelor of Science in Management Accounting and the Bachelor of Early Childhood Education.

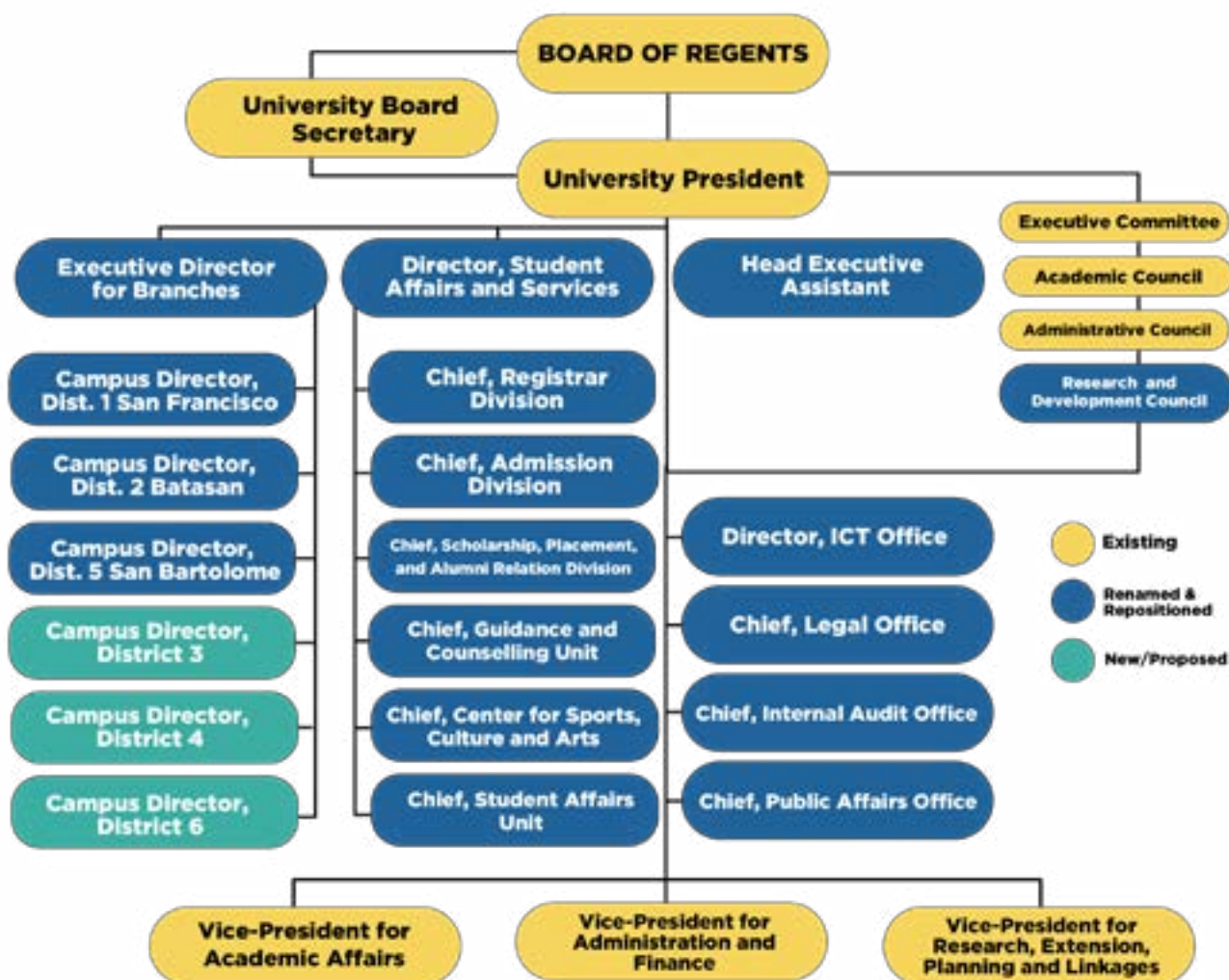

QCU offers relevant academic programs that engage students and professionals in interdisciplinary education that inspires analytic thinking, creativity, and ethical practices through experimental learning. At the core of QCU's commitment is fostering academic excellence through responsive curricular offering.



The Bachelor of Science (BS) in Entrepreneurship, BS Information Technology, BS Industrial Engineering, and BS Electronics Engineering received their Level 1 Accreditation from the Association of Local Colleges and Universities Commission on Accreditation (ALCUCOA). On October 4 to 6, 2022, QCU underwent a rigorous 3-day assessment on the following areas: Governance and Administration, Faculty, Curriculum and Instruction, Student Development and Services, Entrepreneurship and Employability, Community Extension Services, Research, Library, Laboratories, and Physical Plant/Facilities.

The Certificates of Accreditation were awarded to the University on December 22, 2022, by ALCUCOA's President and Executive Director, Dr. Raymundo P. Arcega. Starting AY 2022-2023. This certifies that QCU has been found to be in accordance with the ALCUCOA standards, which was verified by the Technical Review Board Committee, approved by the Board of Directors, and confirmed by the National Network of Quality Assurance Agencies (NNQAA).

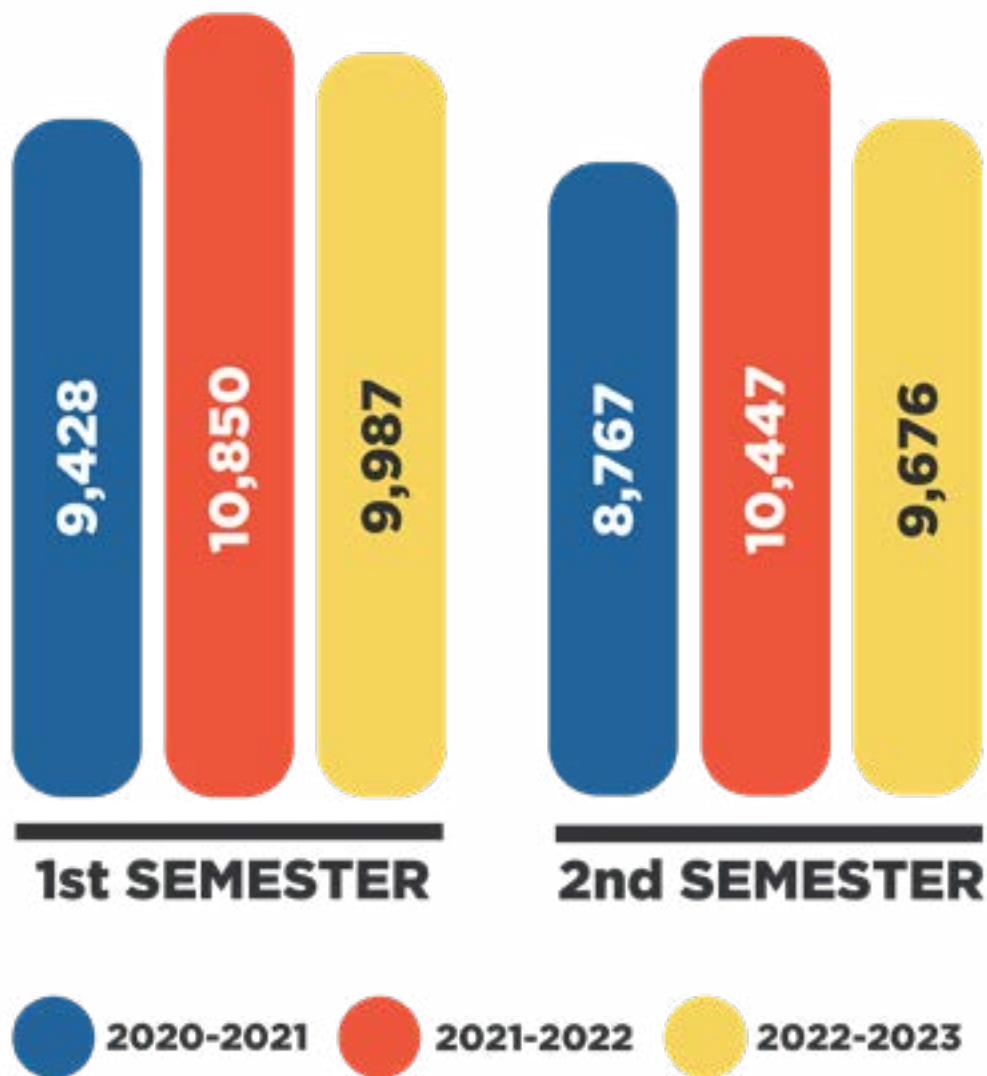

As part of the celebration of the 28th Founding Anniversary of QCU with the theme “Reimagining Education in the Next Normal,” the Office of the Vice-President for Research, Extension, Planning, and Linkages (REPL) organized the QCU Faculty Research Colloquium 2022 on March 4, 2022 via Zoom. The event aims to promote and strengthen our university research culture; provide our faculty members with research load outputs and an opportunity to present their papers; and provide a venue for our educators and university researchers to learn from each other through constructive critiquing.

Dir. Jose Patalinjug III, Regional Director of the Department of Science and Technology – National Capital Region, served as the keynote speaker of the event. Seven faculty research papers were presented during the event.





Business Competency and Employment Satisfaction as Correlates of Performance Among Entrepreneurship Graduates in Selected Colleges and Universities of Quezon City Basis to Personal Enhancement Guide

4. What is the correlation between business competency and employment performance of entrepreneurship graduates?

The results showed there is a positive moderate significant correlation between business competency and employment performance of Entrepreneurship graduates in the area of Adaptability and Knowledge as well as in the area of Adaptability and Disciplinary Skills.

The correlation is at the rate of about 29 percent for Adaptability and Knowledge, and about 30 percent for Adaptability and Disciplinary Skills respectively. This means that as knowledge of the graduates increases, their adaptability to the business environment also increases at a rate of about 29 percent. Likewise, when graduates adaptability to business environment increases, their disciplinary skills also increases at a rate of about 30 percent. There is no significant correlation on the area of business competency and employment performance of entrepreneurship graduates

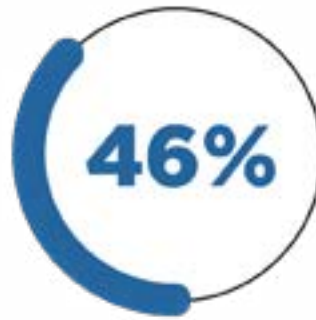

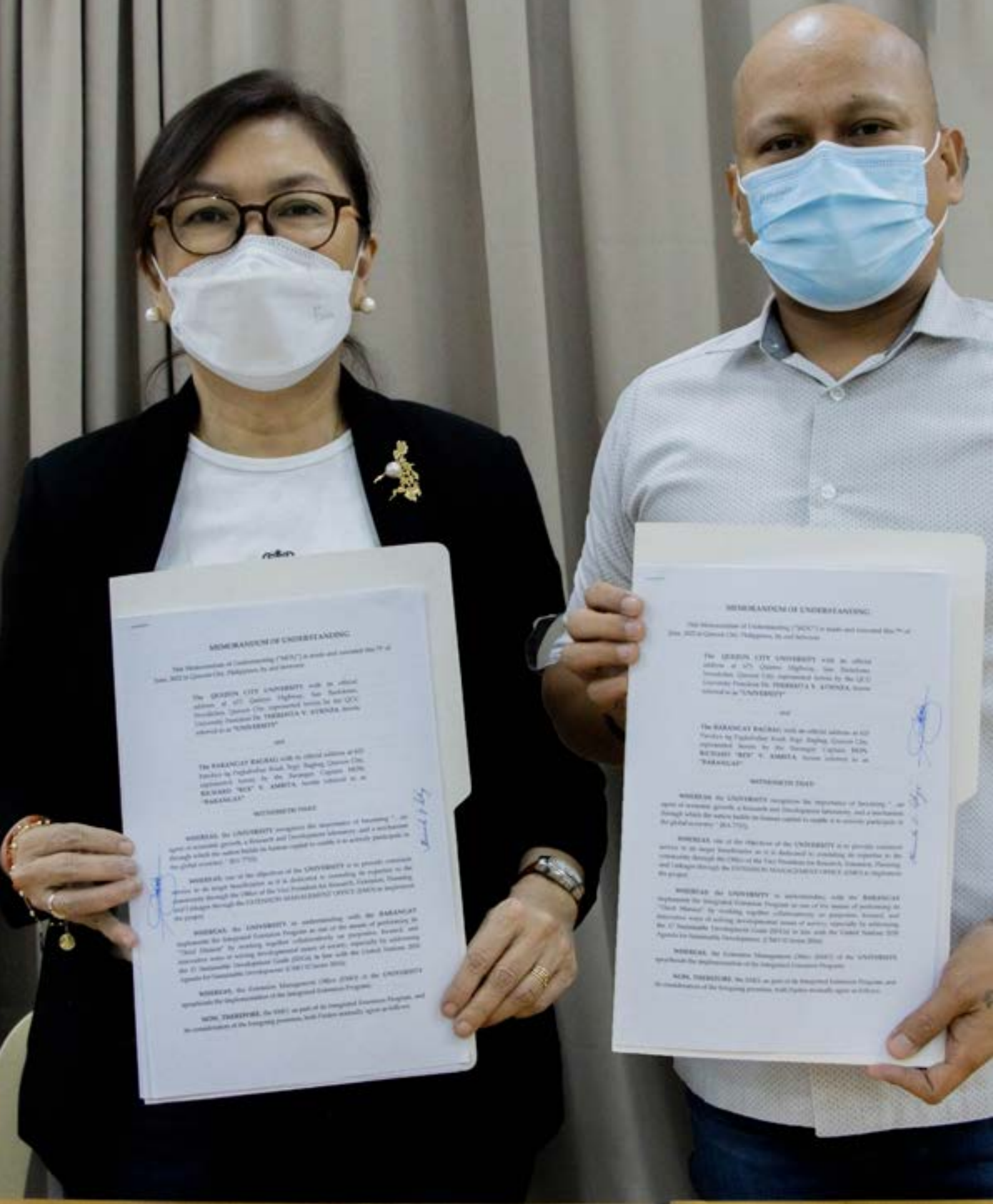
